Creating a Personal ClinicalKey Account

Don't panic if you are ever asked to log in to ClinicalKey!

If you are new to using this library resource you might not be aware that some features require a personal log in. For instance, in order to download the pdf of an e-book you will first need to make a ClinicalKey account. This is free and easy to do.

head to the library website, (<https://www.siumed.edu/lib>) click on the Key Resources tab on the page's banner, then select "ClinicalKey." In the upper right hand corner of the screen you will see an option to register. Alternatively, any time you attempt to access a feature that requires an account you will be prompted to either sign in or register.

your name, e-mail address, and desired password to the form on the page you are taken to. There is an option to add more information to your profile, but that is not necessary to do now.

Once you have successfully submitted the form your registration will be complete! You can now download book chapters from the e-books that the Library subscribes to.

To access ClinicalKey, first Select "register" and enter
